
DRIVING SERVICES FOR AN INCLUSIVE AND RESILIENT ECONOMY

CONFERENCE REPORT

About the Event

The Asia-Pacific Services Coalition (APSC) and APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC) Philippines have organized a Public-Private Dialogue on Services with theme, "Driving Services for an Inclusive and Resilient Economy" last October 12-13.

This two-day virtual conference assembled international experts, APEC officials and business leaders to share experience and best practices, and from there, draw lessons on how the services sector can build-back-better and build-back-broader the world economy.

In 2015, APEC Leaders committed to developing a strategic and long-term services agenda through a region-wide set of actions and mutually agreed targets to be achieved by 2025. The following year, APEC adopted the Services Competitivness Roadmap, which set concrete targets to: (1) reduce the restrictions to services trade and investment, (2) increase the share of services exports, (3) increase the growth in trade in services, and (4) increase APEC's share in global services trade.

This PPD is a collaborative effort to contribute to this year's midterm review of the services roadmap.





How would you rate the overall event?




How would you rate the organization of the event?
